

Ideographic

By the association of ideas, purely pictographic writing developed into an ideographic form of writing, whereby the pictures signify ideas other than those which they depict. A combination of single pictures and the making of new and more complex pictures enabled further ideas to be conveyed ; E.g. A representation of the sun ocould signify 'bright' or 'day'.

The sign for plough The could mean 'to plough' or 'farmer'.

The sign for foot ____ represented ideas connected with the foot such


as the verbs 'to go' and 'to stand'.

A combination of the sign for mouth






signified the verb 'to eat'
